

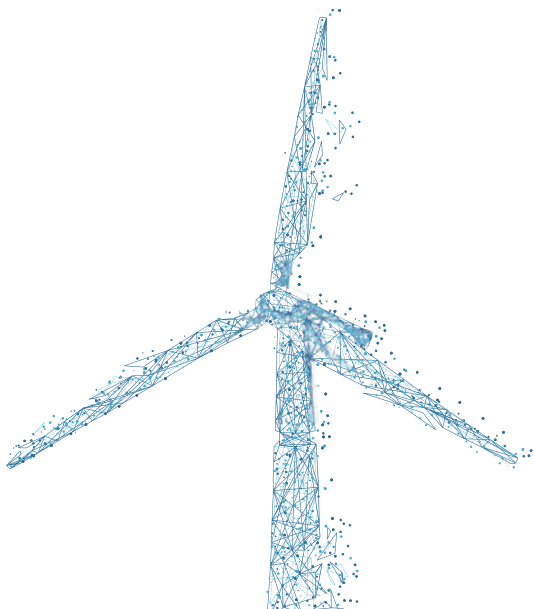
In 2017, Texas generated 18 percent of its energy from wind and solar.

Power-hungry industries are tapping into the state's renewable energy sources, not solely for environmental reasons, but also because it makes good economic sense.

"My hat is off to lawmakers and policy leaders who understand the wind energy industry is a revving economic engine that is firing on all cylinders — driving jobs and investment in Texas — and a major force in lowering costs for the energy consumer," says Jeffrey Clark, president of The Wind Coalition.

The American Wind Energy Association reports that Texas wind energy represents more than 22,000 jobs and a capital investment of more than \$38 billion. Says Clark, "Even in the oil patch, drilling is made more affordable thanks to cheaper electricity coming from nearby wind projects."

The General Motors assembly plant in Arlington, churning out high-end SUVs at a pace of one per minute, aims to meet all of its electricity needs with wind power in 2018. It already relies on 50 percent wind energy purchased from Texas wind farms in Concho County and Edinburg.
