

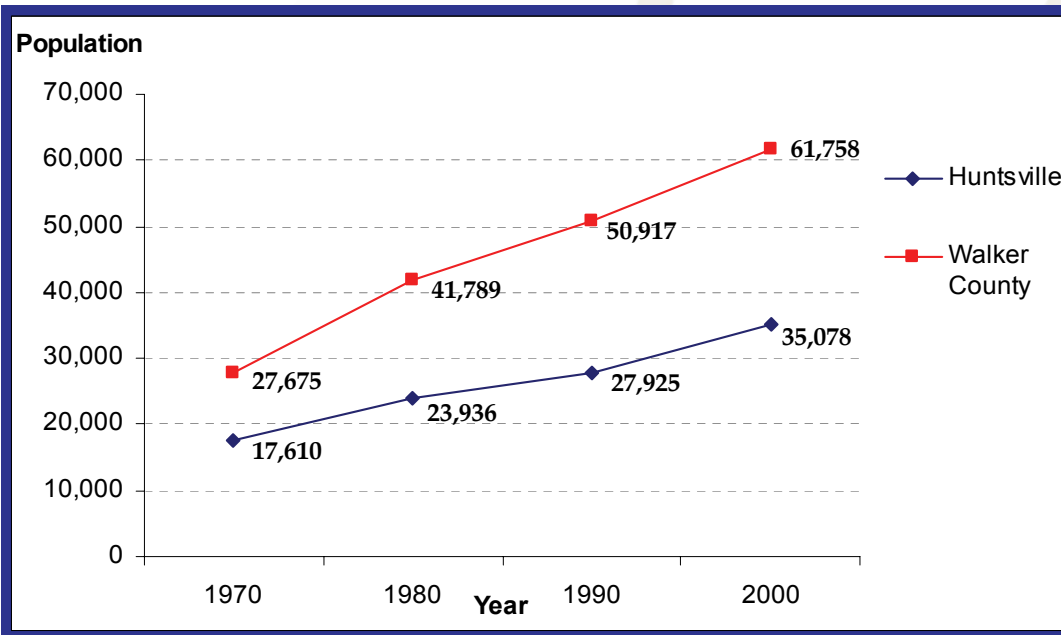

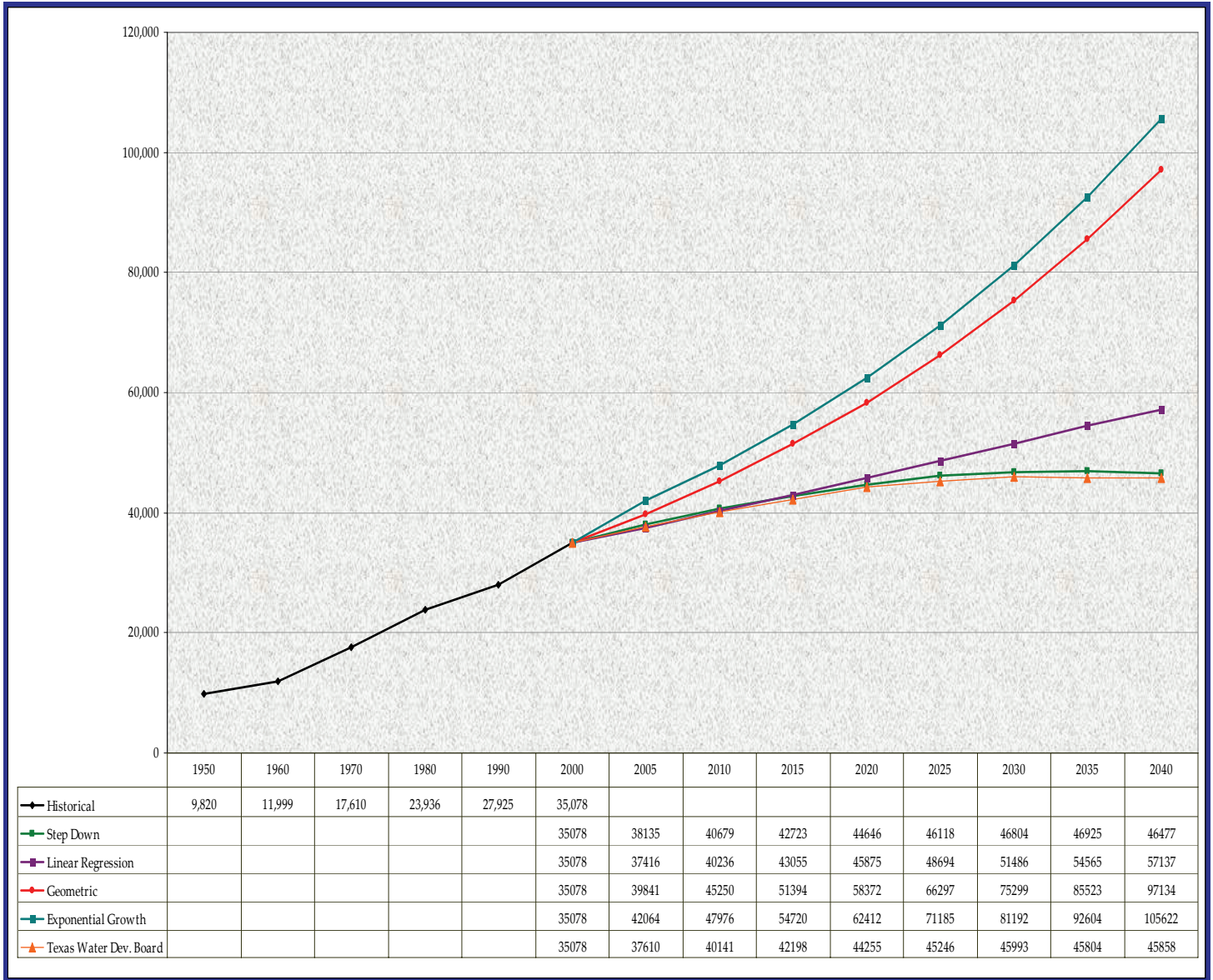

Figure B.1, Population Change (1970-2000)



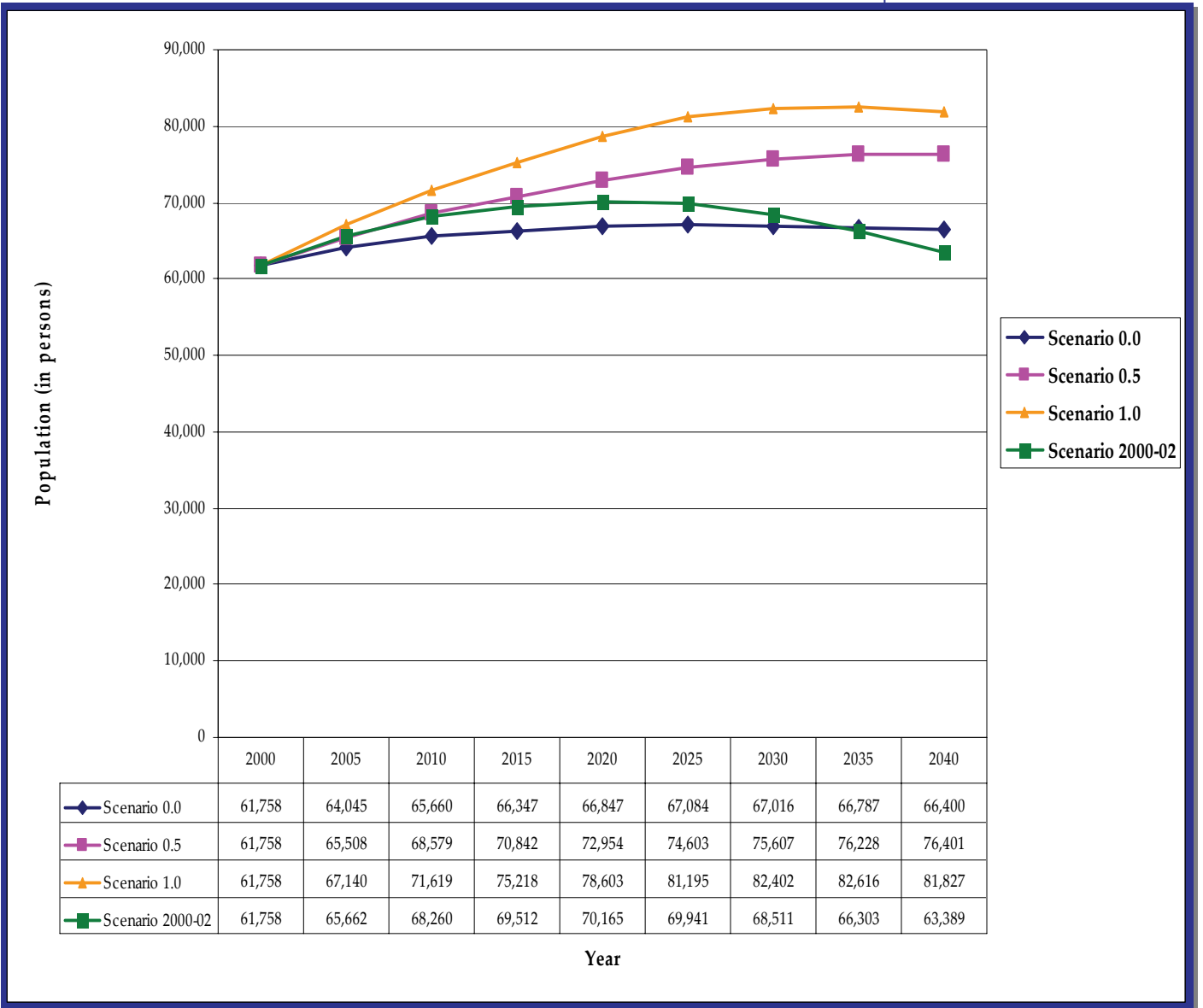

Figure B.2, Huntsville Population Projections



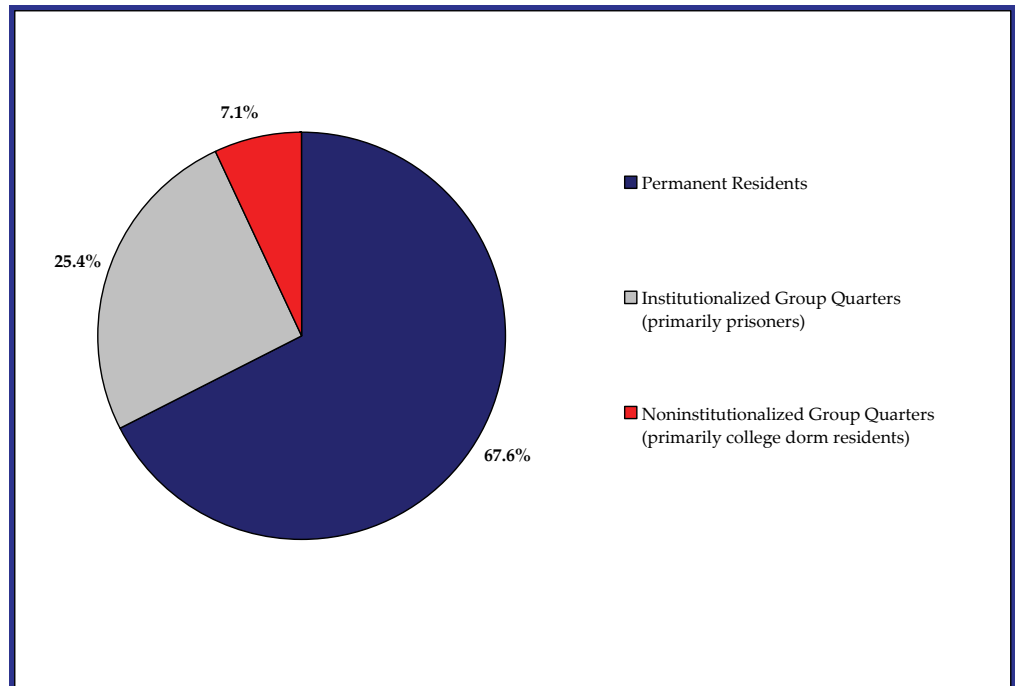

Figure B.3, Walker County Population Projections



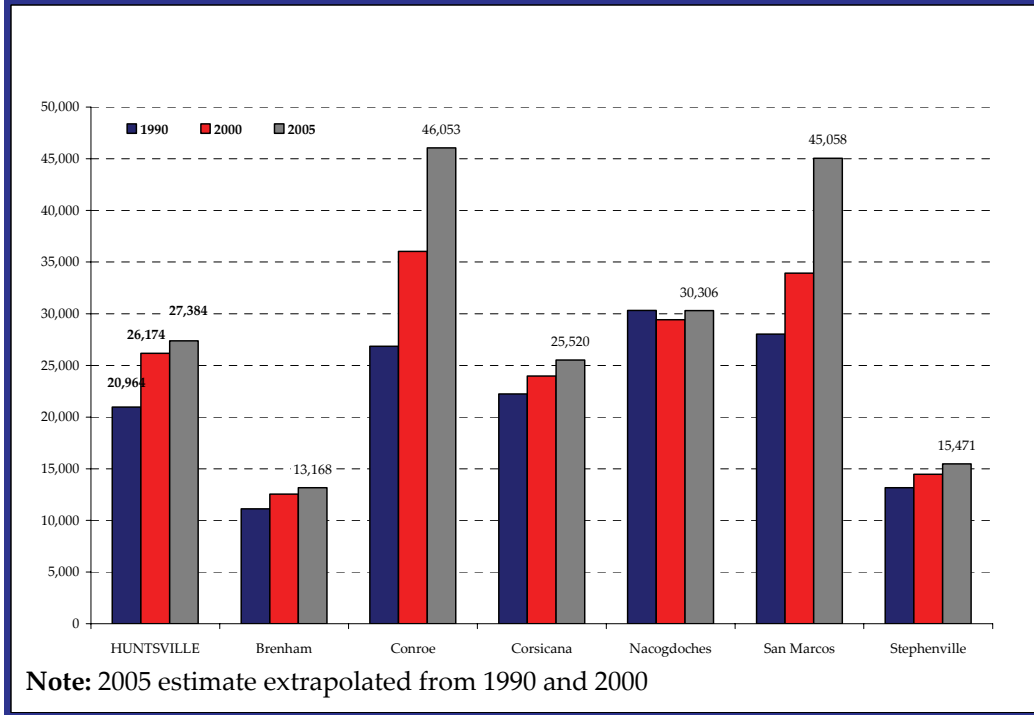

Figure B.4, Huntsville Population Groups, 2000



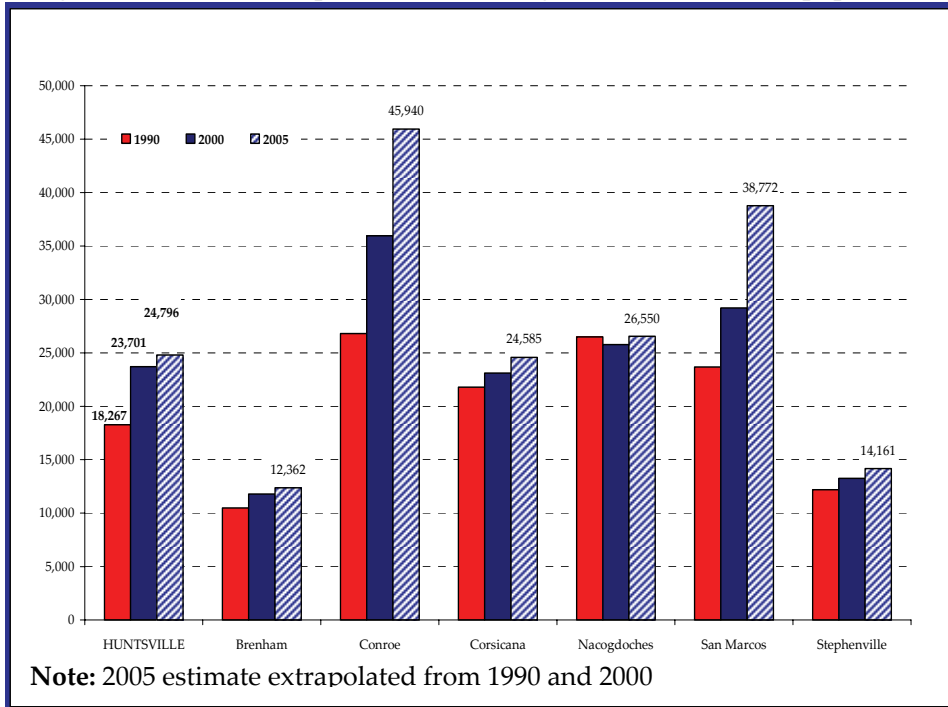

Figure B.5, Resident Population (excluding inmate populations)



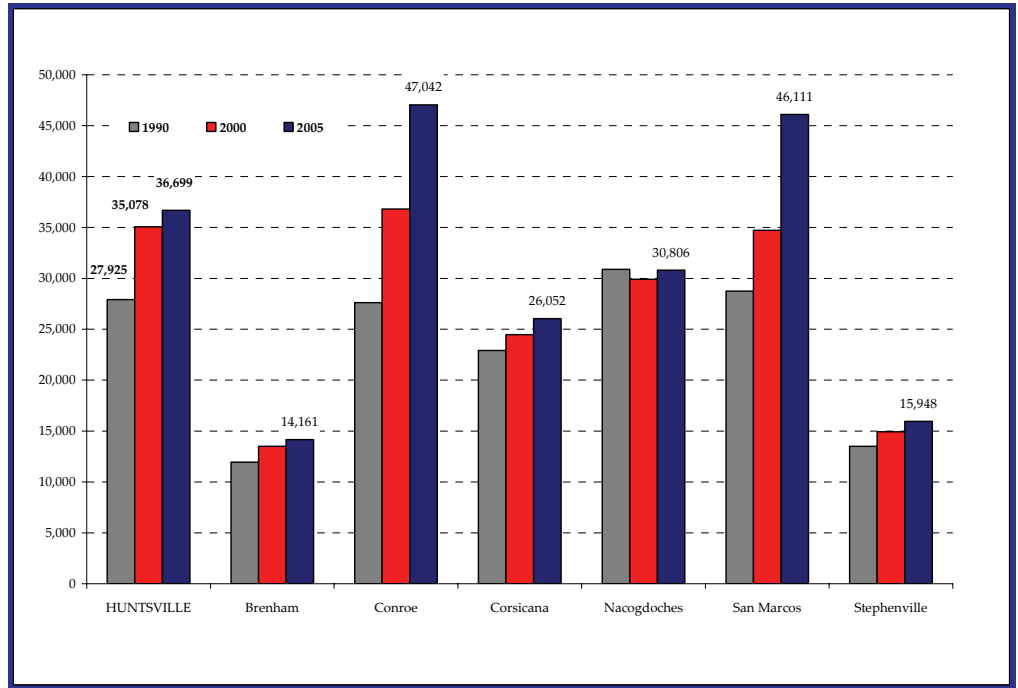

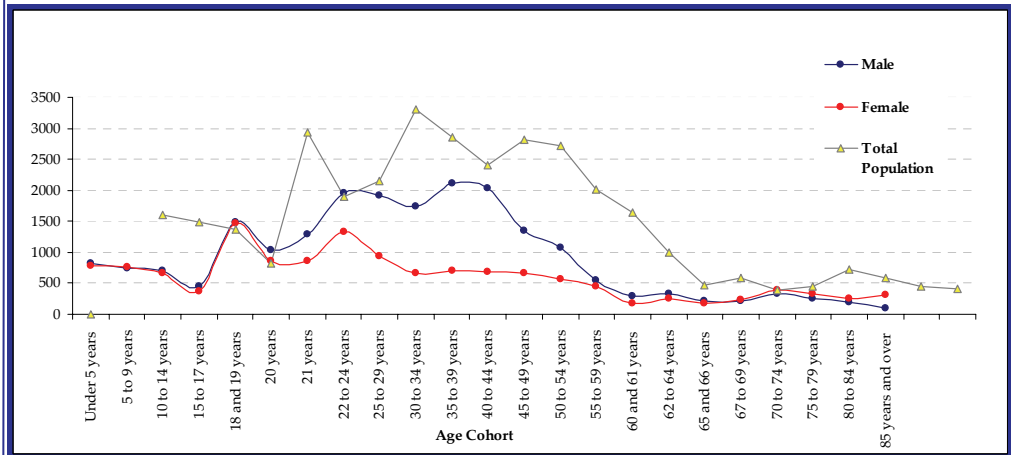

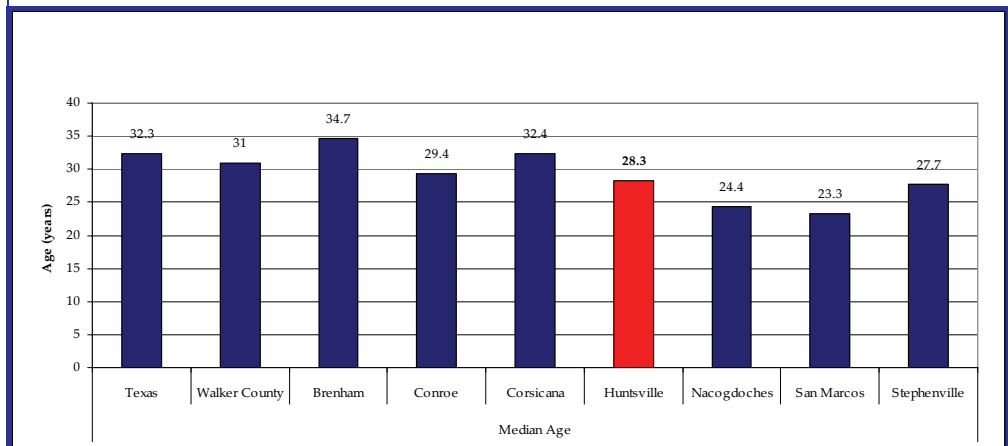

Figure B.8, Huntsville Age/Gender, 2000



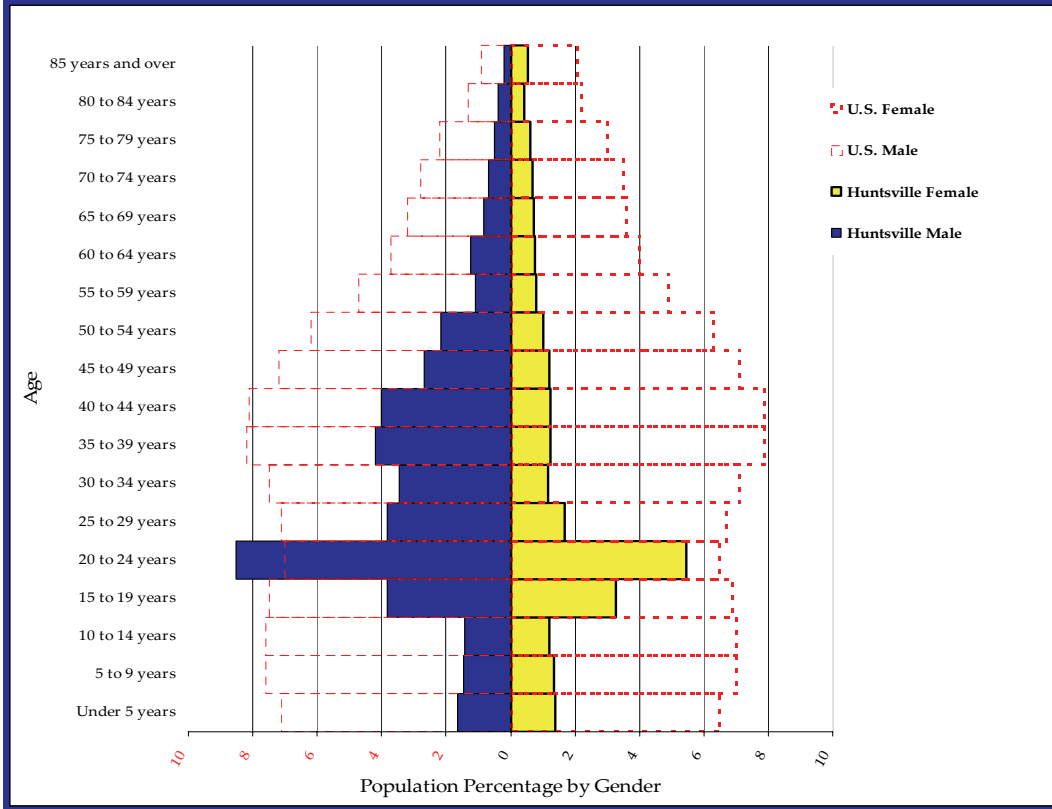

Figure B.9, Median Age, 2000



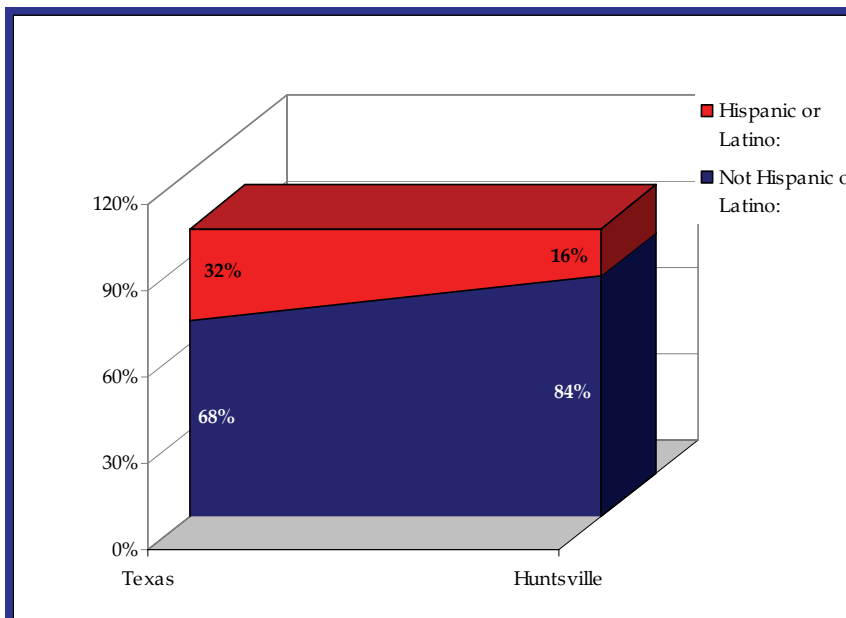

Figure B.10, Age-Gender Pyramid for Huntsville and U.S., 2000



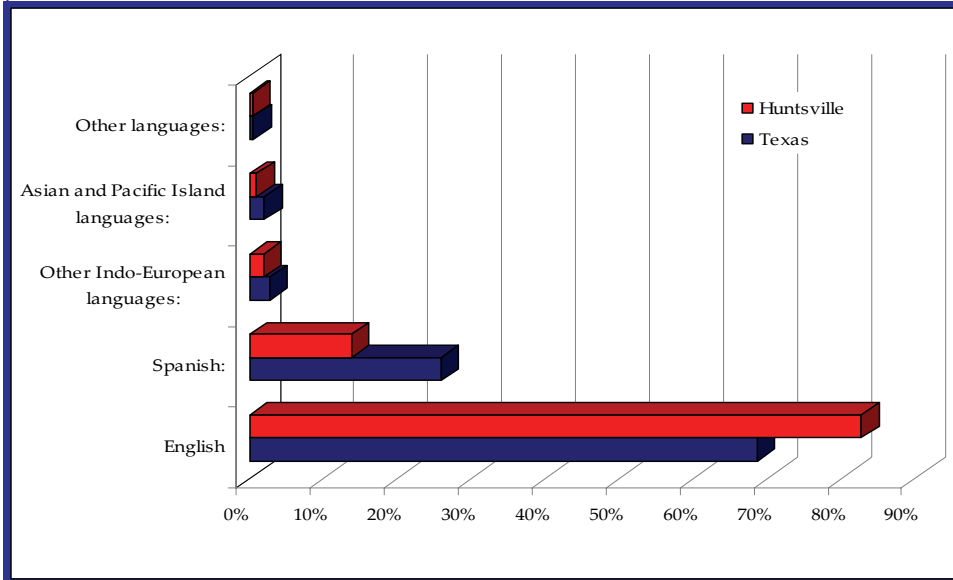

Figure B.11, Latino Population, 2000



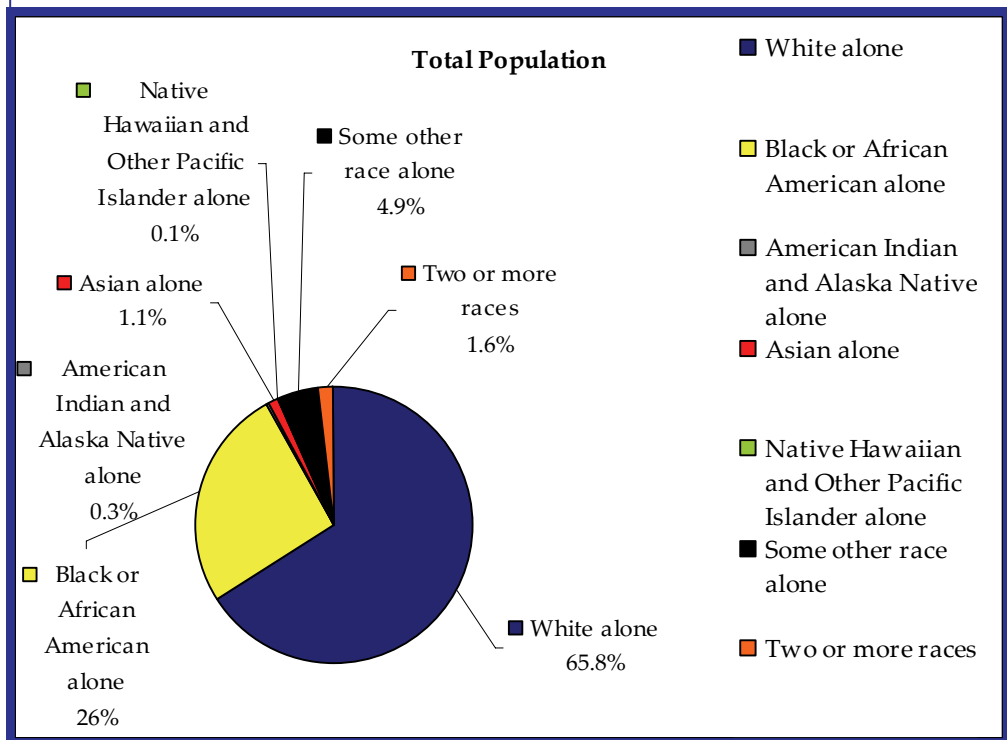

Figure B.12, Language Spoken in the Home, 2000



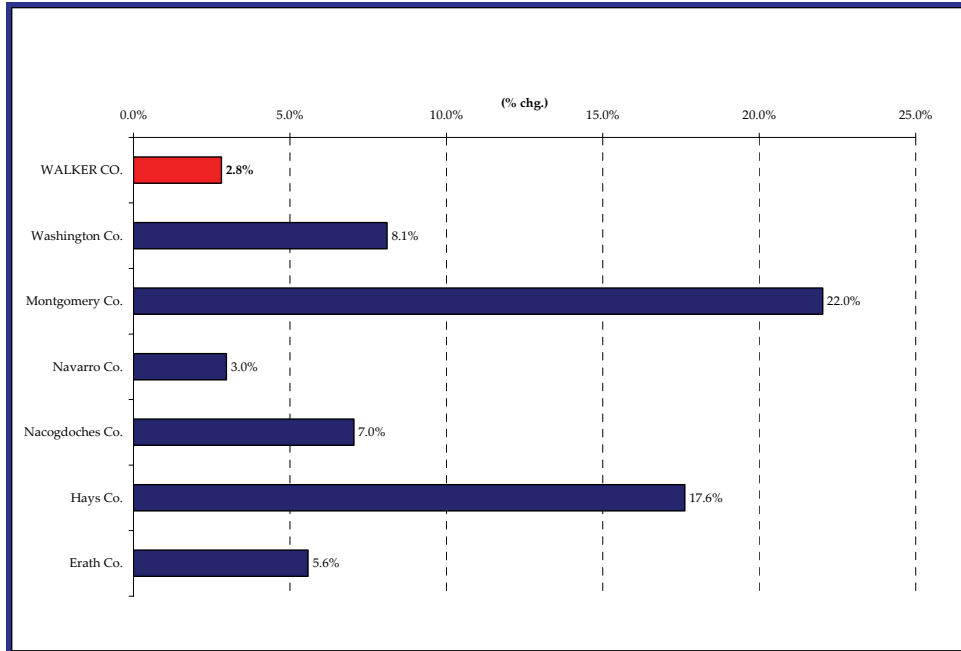

Figure B.13, Total Population, 2000



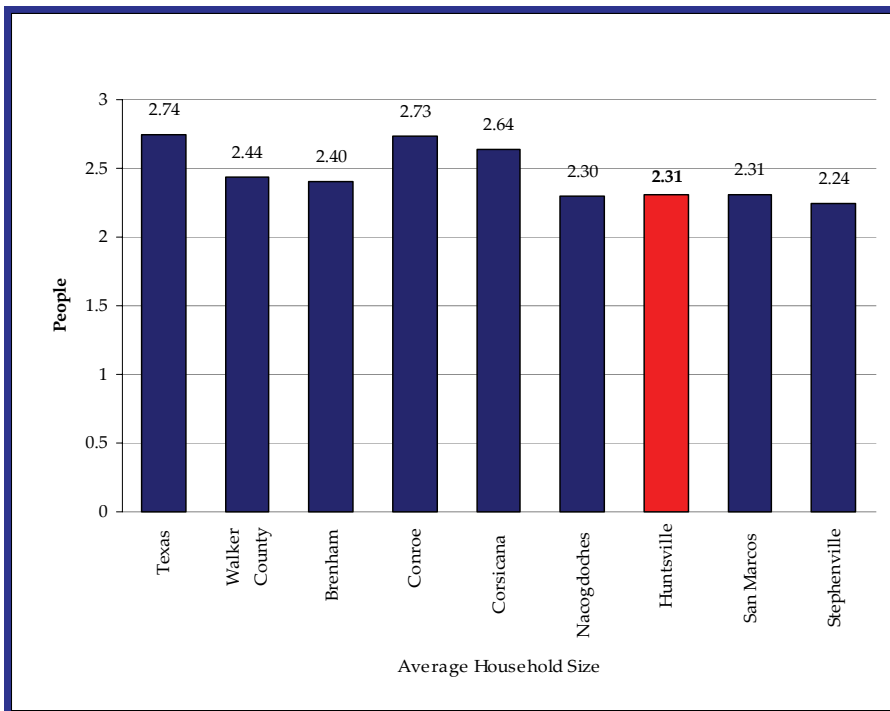

Figure B.14, Labor Force Growth



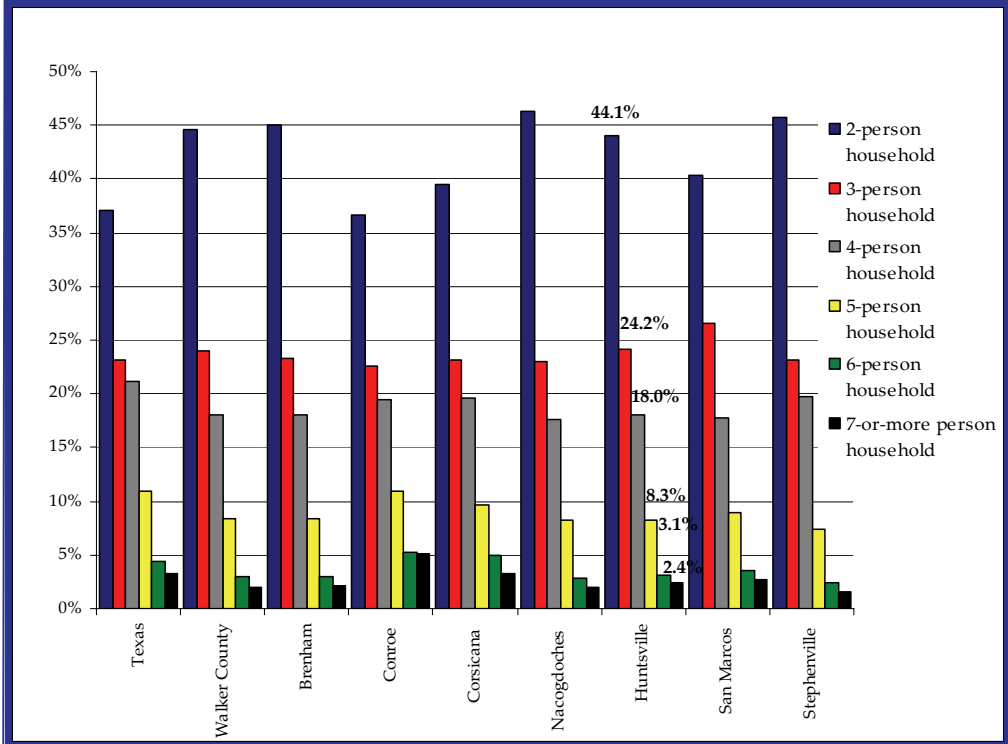

Figure B.15, Average Household Size, 2000



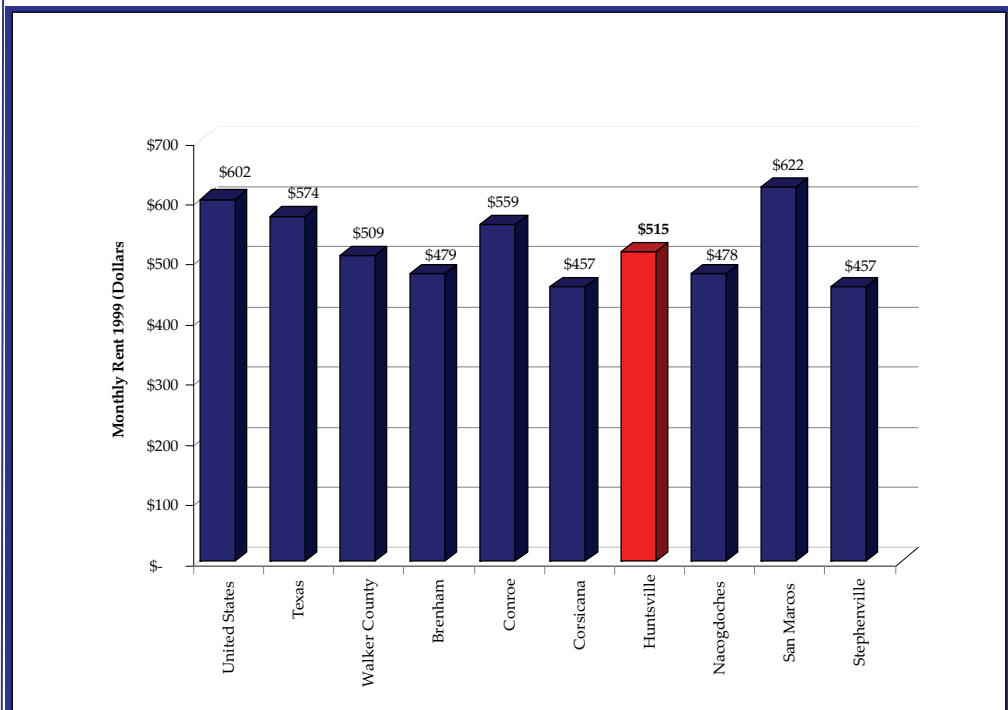

Figure B.16, Household Composition, 2000



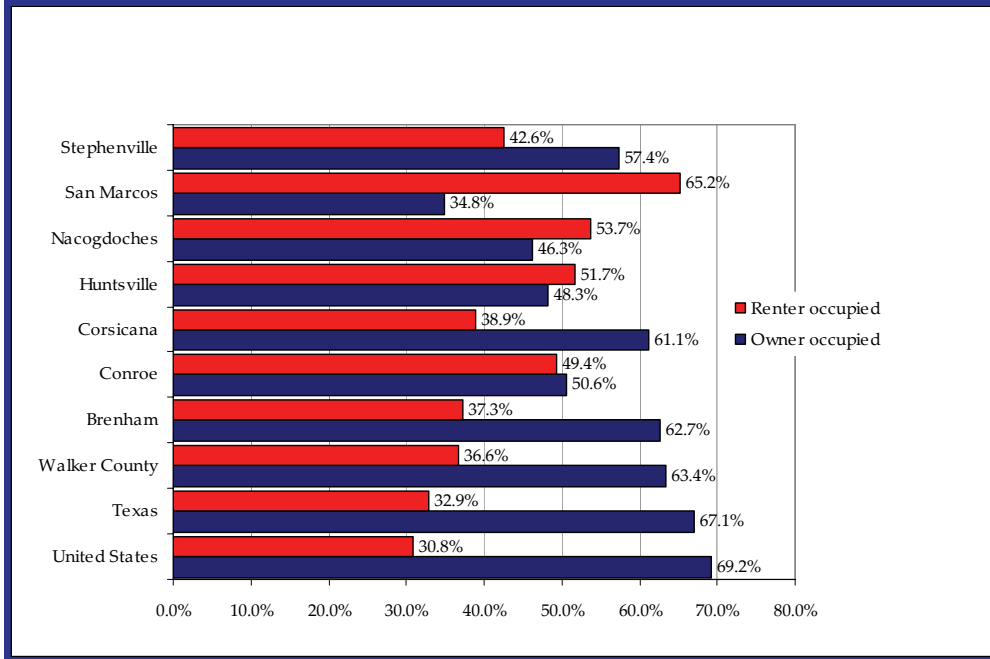

Figure B.17, Median Gross Rent, 2000



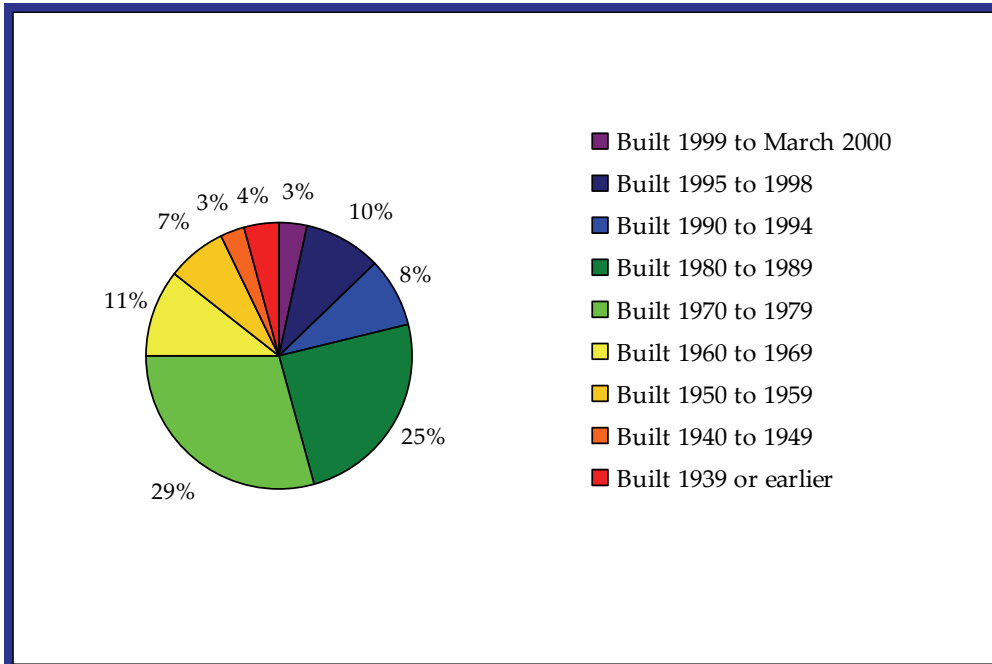

Figure B.18, Housing Occupancy, 2000



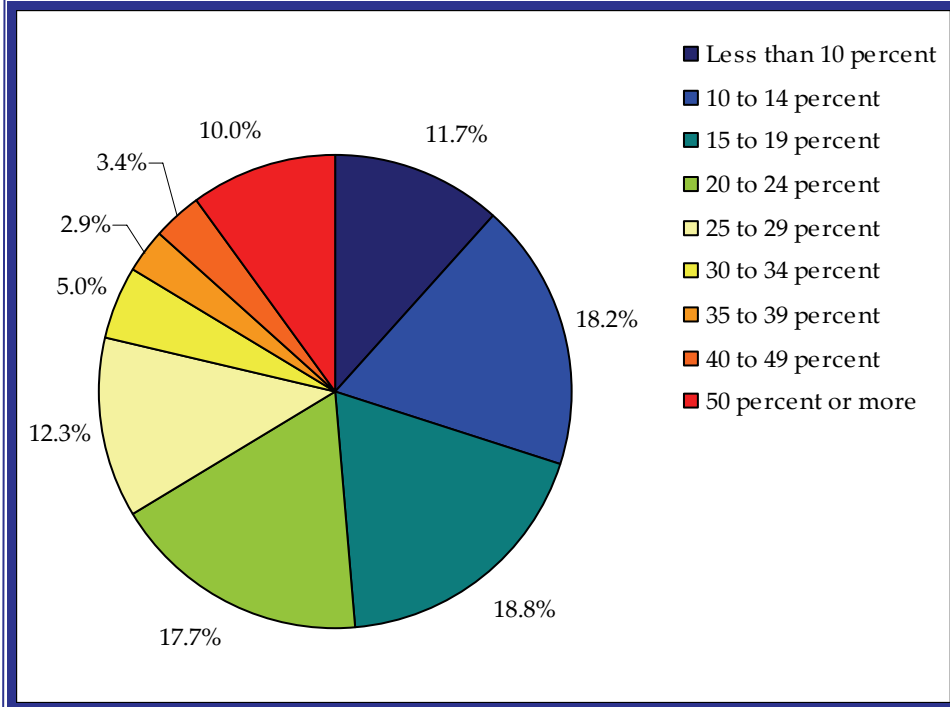

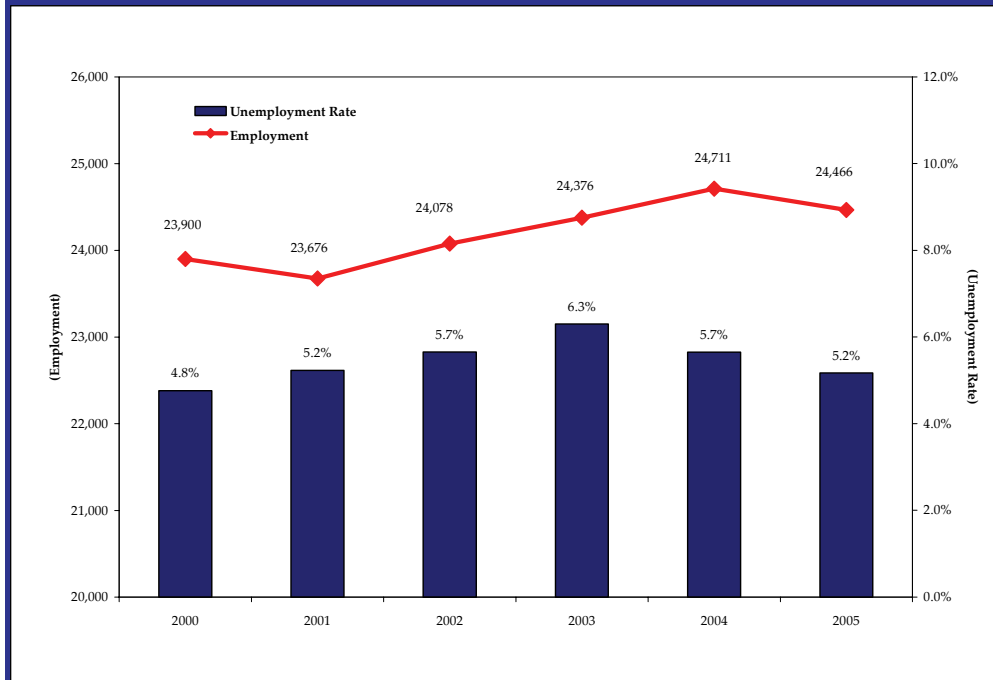

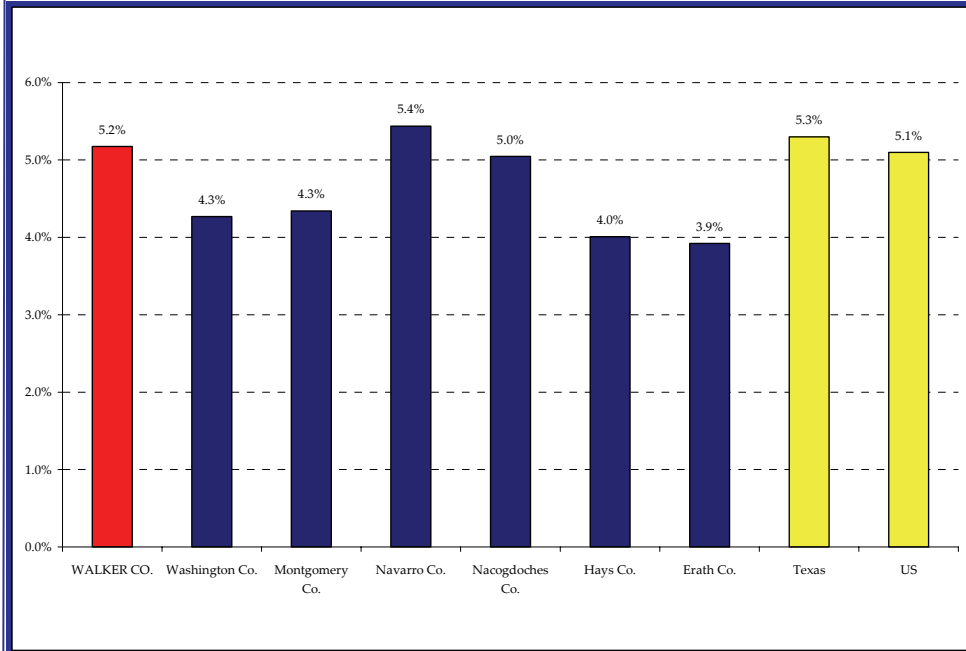

Figure B.21, Walker County Employment and Unemployment Rates, 2000-2005



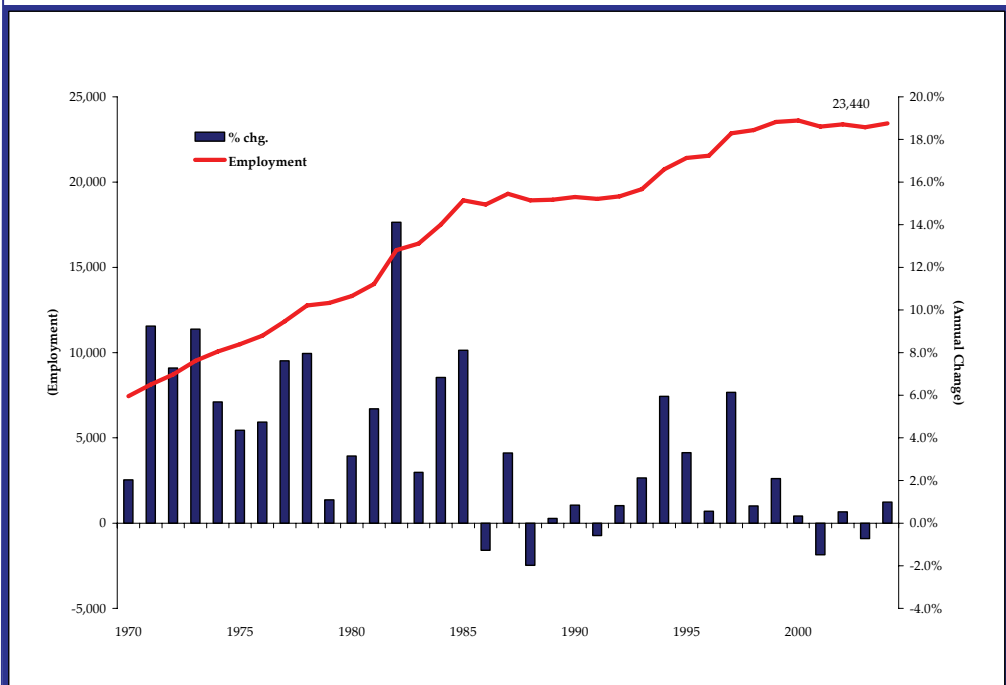

Figure B.22, Unemployment Rate Comparison, 2005



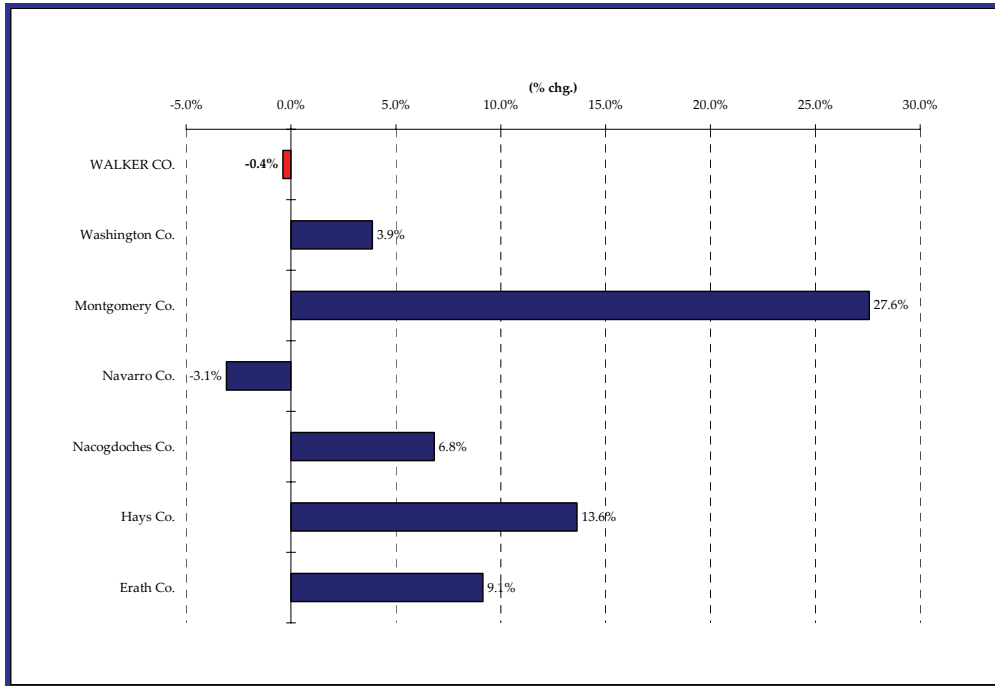

Figure B.23, Walker County Wage and Employment, 1970-2004



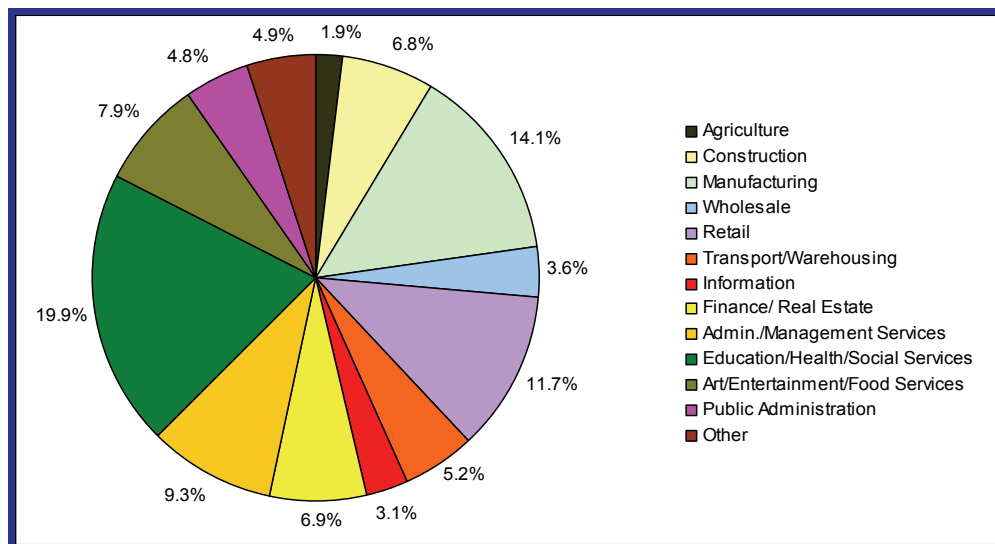

Figure B.24, Wage and Salary Employment Growth, 1999 - 2004



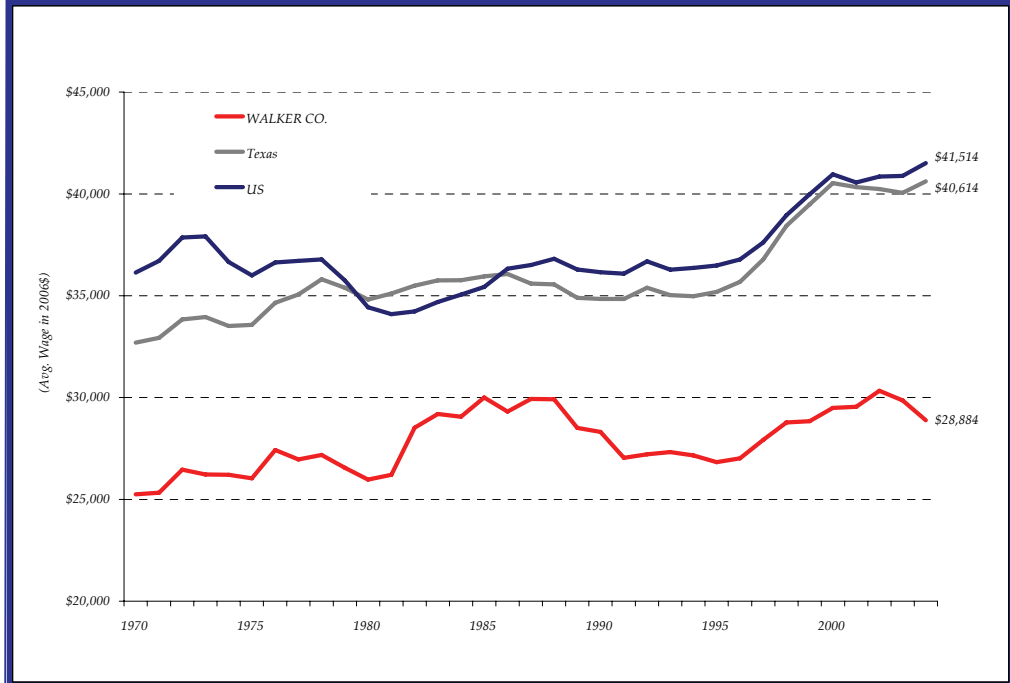

Figure B.25, Industry – Huntsville, Texas, 2000



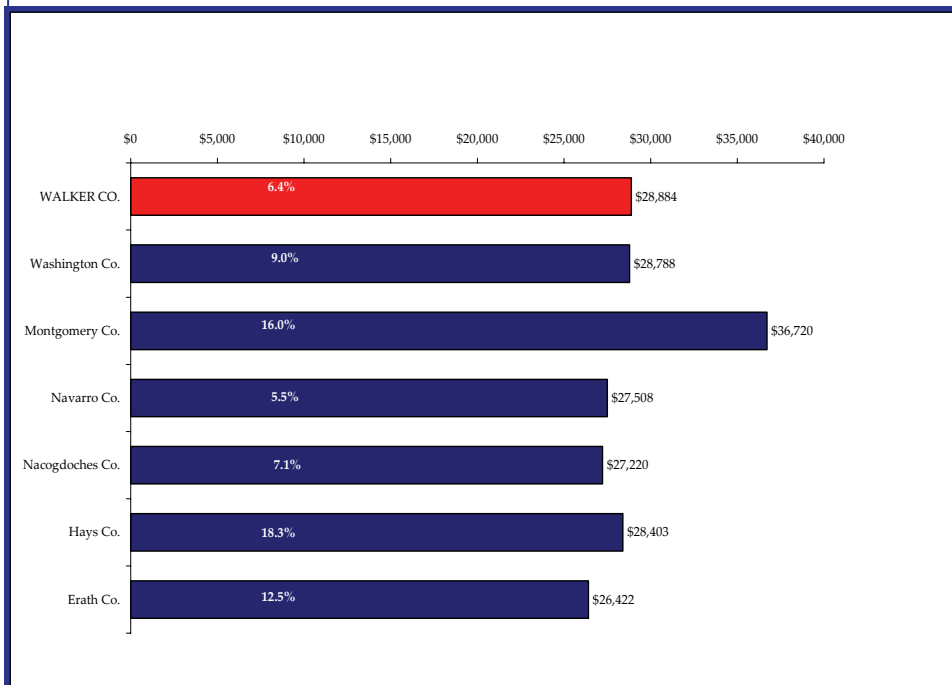

Figure B.26, Average Wage per Job, 1970-2004



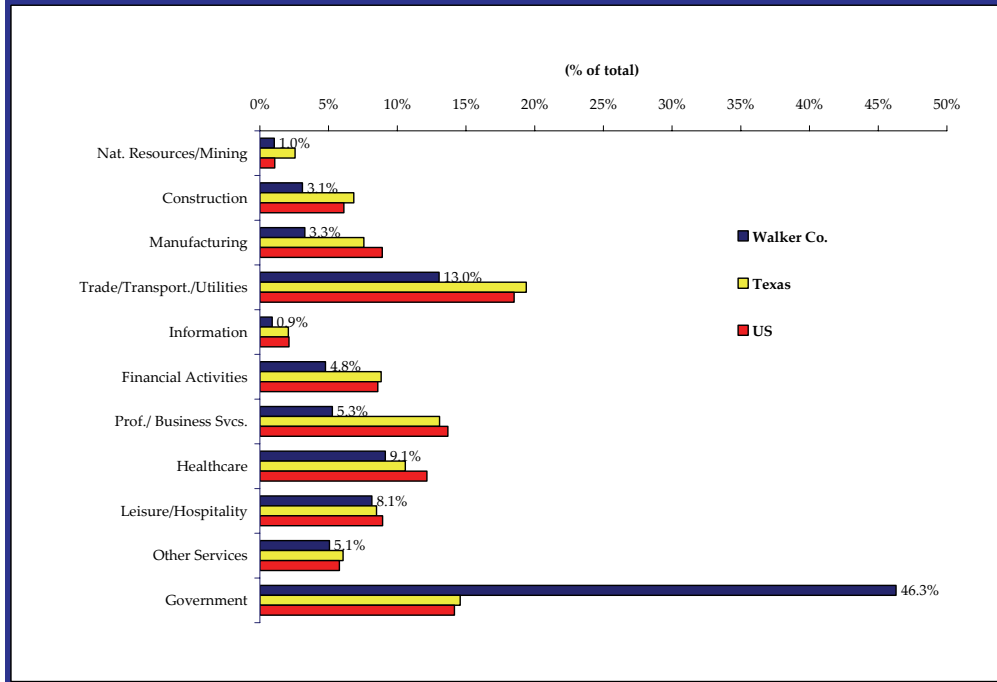

Figure B.27, Wage per Job (2004) & Wage Gains (1994-2004)



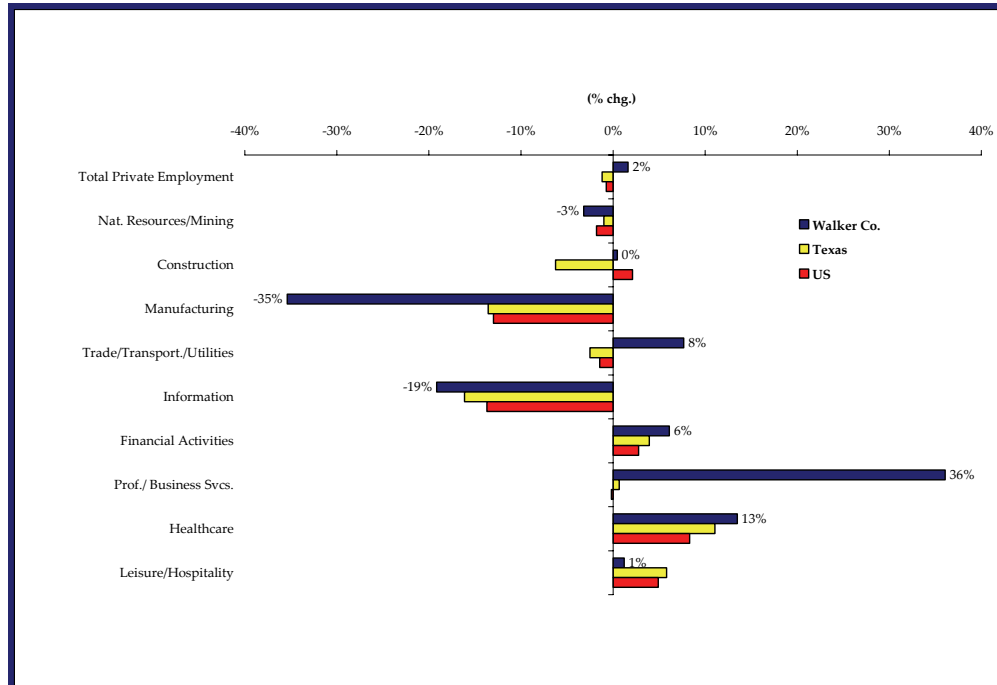

Figure B.28, Nonfarm Employment by Industry, 2004



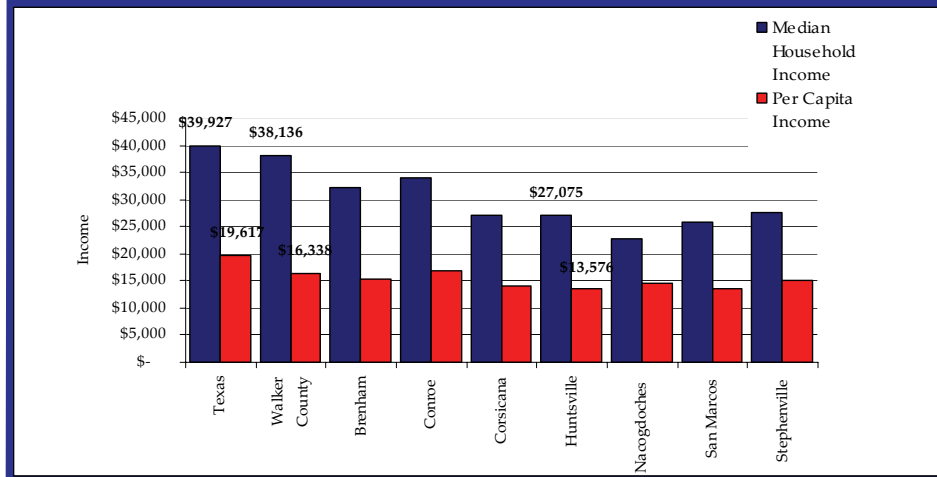

Figure B.29, Private Employment Change by Industry, 2001 - 2004



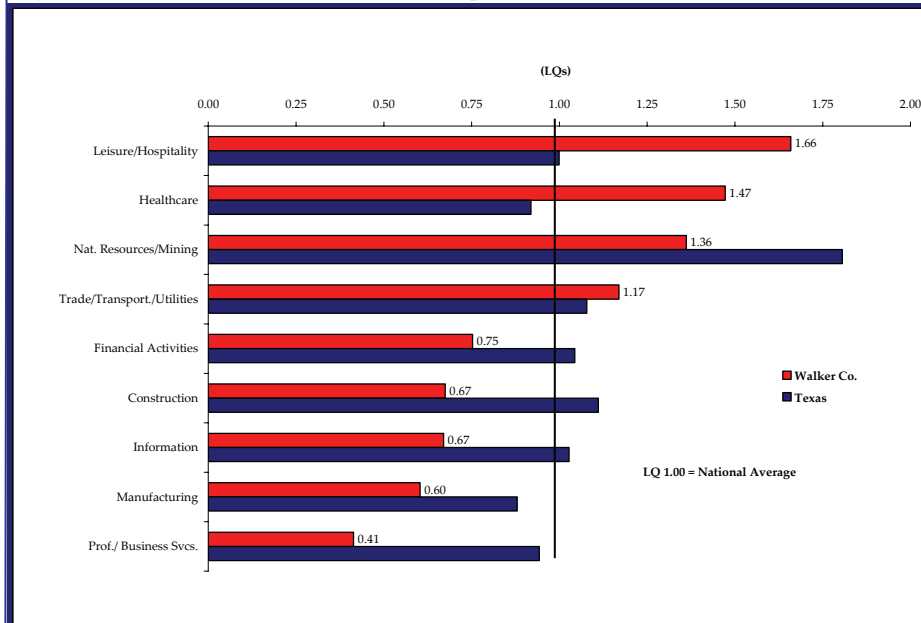

Location Quotients

A location quotient (LQ) is calculated as a local industry's share of total local employment divided by the same industry's share of employment at the state level. If the local industry and state industry are perfectly proportional, the location quotient will be 1.00. If an industry is heavily concentrated at the local level (e.g., automotive industry in Detroit, technology in Silicon Valley, gambling in Las Vegas), then the location quotient will be higher than 1.00. Conversely, if the industry is sparsely concentrated at the local level, the location quotient will be lower than 1.00. Generally, LQs greater than 1.25 represent high industry concentrations, while LQs less than 0.75 represent weak concentrations.

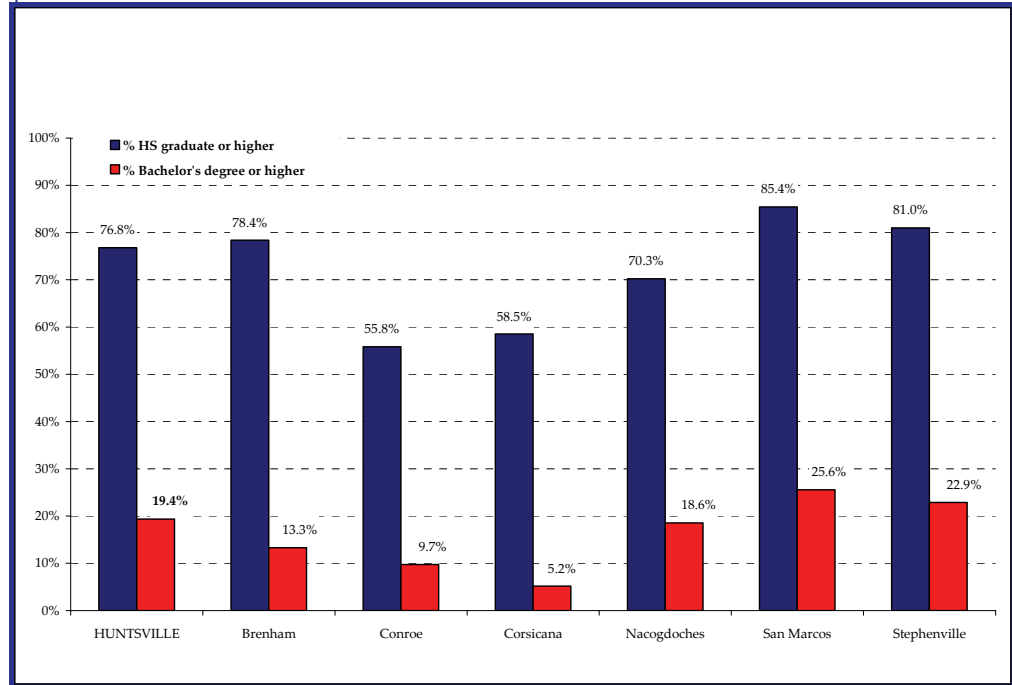

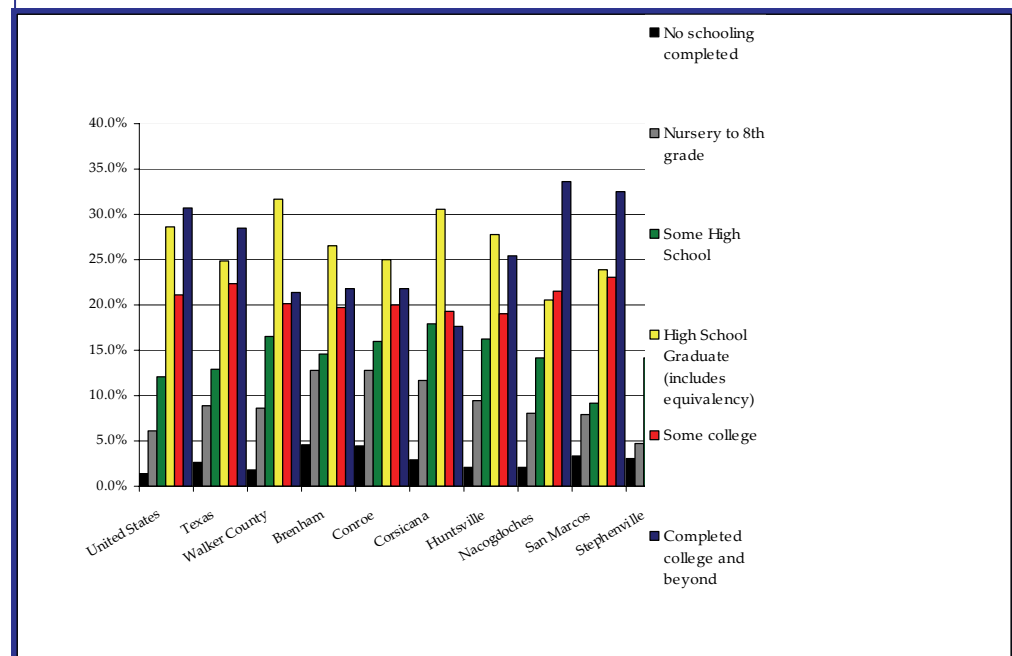
